A message to Amibay members

Would you give a total stranger, that you have just met in the street and that you barely know, a large sum of money, say over 150 Dollars, Euros or Pounds, and just walk away? Would you do something just like this with a desirable item bought over the Internet, in the knowledge that you don't know the stranger's full contact details, you only have a webmail or mobile-based e-mail address and don't have any other verifiable details, yet you choose to pay them by PayPal Gift, thereby making it almost impossible to recover the funds?

Would you also accept that the goods will be sent uninsured and/or untracked, thereby making it virtually impossible for the item(s) to be located and shipped on to you?

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We strongly advise our members to pay for items using Paypal with the fee payment when the item's value is greater than £10 (or is a sum of money that you are not prepared to lose, by just 'giving' it away).

We further advise our members that for high-value items, that you obtain the seller's full contact details, such as full name, postal address and telephone number. These are crucial details that can be passed to law enforcement agencies in the country concerned, if a fraudulent transaction has been found to have occurred at a later date.

We also advise all members to use tracked and insured shipping wherever possible. Any member purchasing an item using the Paypal gift method and/or asking for items to be shipping uninsured can only expect limited help from the staff, in the event of a trading dispute. If the details you have are only basic and you do not have the other person's full details, there is no guarantee that we will be able to track them down for you.

To trade with an AmiBay member who is using webmail based e-mail addresses and asks for payment by PayPal Gift or Bank Transfer should always be viewed as carrying an element of risk and the risk increases with the value of the item you intend to buy.

Also, a member with a low post count offering high-value items should trigger further questions as to who this person actually is before sending them large sums of money as a gift; it may end up being just a gift and you may not receive anything in return.

It is your responsibility to manage that risk down to a level you feel comfortable with, before parting with large sums of money. If you pay by PayPal and accept the fees, using a bank card or credit card, you are protected by both PayPal and the card issuer against fraud and you stand a much higher chance of getting your funds back if a transaction goes badly.

 **ZX Spectrum +3e IDE & games...how to**

First off you need the following.

ZX spectrum 128K +2B or +3
+3e ROMS (x2)
Zetr0s IDE or similar 8 bit IDE interface
IDE to CF adaptor from China
CF card - small is ok
Windows computer
a bunch of .z80 or .sna spectrum games / progs /demos

and the following software.

Software and how to get games on the +3

(im not covering rom burning here and i assume you have zetr0s ide setup and formatted in the spectrum+3 /2)

Zetr0 posted a quick guide on FORMATTING the CF in the spectrum , see here.

step 1

turn off the speccy and remove the CF, pop it in to your windows machine and open DRIVEIMAGE (pic1)

step2

click on the CF drive / removable media and check hdf256 is highlighted and read from the card (you are making a HDF image of the drive) (pic2)

step3

Click READ from selected drive and wait a few mins until all the sectors are copied. (pic3)

step4

Quit drive image for the moment.

step5

Open StrowSaw.exe (a GUI will open) (pic5)

step6

Click file - open hard disk image. (pic6)

step7

find your copied / saved .HDF image that you made a few moments ago and open it. (pic7) - your folders / partitions will be empty , i have 3 files in mine for you to see.

step8

Click the partition you wish to copy to and click ITEMS - Put files in binary mode (pic8)

step9

find you .sna / .z80 images on your windows PC and select one or all (pic9)

step10

The files will then be copied to your spectrum.HDF partition (pic10)

step11

Close the StrowSaw.exe program - youve done with it. (pic 11)

step12

Open drive image again (pic 12) and select WRITE to selected drive

step13

once again find and select the .HDF that you made earlier. (pic13)

step14

when asked to copy the .HDF to your CF card - say yes (pic14)

step15

files will be copied - please wait.

step16

Select QUIT when all sectors are copied (the status bar is full (pic16)

step17

Remove the CF from the windows machine and pop it back in the spectrum and boot it up - turn it on and select +3 BASIC (pic17)

step18

type CAT on your spectrum to see the contents of your partition.

If drive A is accessed type VERIFY "C:" to change to the CF partition and type CAT again.
a list of files should appear. (pic18)

step19

type SPECTRUM "yourgame.z80" or spectrum "yourgame.sna" for example SPECTRUM "AIRWOLF.Z80" and press enter (pic 19 & 20)

DONE 😊

I hope this guide helps in some way its taken me quite a while to sort this out.






you have a loader, a screen and code

the loader load's the screen into screen memory and the loads the code at a given position.

at its basic level you just need to edit a little basic and change the file names, at its most complex you will be loading patches and locking rom location - even adding pokes, trainers etc.
